What is an Apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is a genuine job and combines practical training in a job with study. An apprentice will:

- work alongside experienced staff
- gain job-specific skills
- earn a wage and get holiday pay
- be given time for study related to their role (the equivalent of one day a week)
- an alternative to university

Why apply?

- Earn a real wage;
- Be trained in the skills employers want;
- Set yourself up for the future
- An opportunity to learn on the job

What levels are there?

All apprenticeships include elements of on the job and off the job training, leading to industry recognised standards or qualifications. Some apprenticeships also require an assessment at the end of the programme to assess the apprentice`s ability and competence in their job role.

Name	Level	Equivalent education level
Intermediate	2	5 GCSE passes at grade A*-C or 9 - 4
Advanced	3	2 A level passes / Level 3 Diploma / Internal Baccalaureate
Higher	4, 5, 6 and 7	Foundation degree and above
Degree	6 & 7	Bachelor's or master's degree
